#### **OUR VISIT TO THE GREAT WAR FLYING MUSEUM**

The OJOA was specially invited to attend the Great War Flying Museum with our Jaguars on Saturday June 16th.

The Museum which is located at the Brampton Caledon Airport has eight highly authentic flying replicas (built using original plans and period correct engines) of WW1 Fighter aircraft including the Red Baron's Fokker Triplane. We were able to get up close and personal with these historic air planes and tour the interesting museum.

Six daring members were lucky enough to fly as the rear seat observer, with an Air Canada pilot at the controls, of a 1917 Sopwith One and One Half V Strutter British two seater fighter plane manning a Lewis machine gun facing rearward to ward of attacking German fighters.

Many thanks to Steve Sherriff who organized the event. The weather was great & the sky was limitless!

#### **OJOA 2018 Concours Summary**

The Ontario Jaguar Owners Association's 51st Concours d'Elegance has come and gone, and now joins the previous 50 shows as another piece of OJOA history. Each Concours has been unique, and brought something memorable to the people who were a part. This one was no different.

One of the yardsticks used to measure a show's success is attendance. And the eye-opener here is how similar it was to the 2017 event. Last year we had 51 Jags officially entered and of that, 46 registered to be judged. This year we recorded an entry field of 52, and 43 received judges' attention. The human attendance was slightly less this year, but certainly the need was still there for the caterer to supply 120 meals.....same as in 2017. Understandably there was a lot of hype and promotion for our 50<sup>th</sup> Concours, so to attract comparable interest in 2018 was both unexpected and rewarding.

So much for similarities, but was there anything that made this year's Concours stand out? There were many, but the most obvious was the sheer variety of Jaguars on display. The entry list spanned 71 years from a 1947 Jaguar 3.5 litre saloon to a trio of 2018 Jags.....an XF-S, an XE-R, and an F-Pace. I think that it's safe to claim that the magnitude of this spread is a first for the OJOA.

There were many other notables that made this 2018 edition stand out. How about not three, not four, but five carcarrying trailers! If this becomes the norm, we may have to consider a judging category for trailers. (LOL) Maybe this was to be expected when entrants from as far as New Jersey and Illinois navigated their way to Wellesley. Another feature, which may be a first at an OJOA Concours, was the registration of three Jags each by *two* enthusiastic participants.....Brad Marsland and Tony Burgess. Equally rare was the fact that six other entrants contributed multiple Jaguars to our Concours. We have to salute the eight individuals who made the effort to bring *eighteen* pristine Jags to our rural location......that's dedication! An interesting detail involves one of Tony's entries. His Mark II arrived at the Concours site by transport at 10:45 pm Saturday evening. Considering that it came non-stop from an American restoration shop, it was a case of impeccable timing. I was asked to inspect the precious load by cell phone light prior to signing off. This was not the most comfortable delivery acceptance signature that I've made, given that under these pitch black rural lighting conditions, a door may have been missing and I may not have noticed. (LOL) Here is another record breaker. *Two* JCNA Championship category classes were won by cars with a perfect score of 100%.......Don Lingelbach's 2018 XF-S and Ron & Gary Schotland's 1966 E-Type from New Jersey.

Let's pull some more superlatives out of our database. There were 29 Jags judged under JCNA rules, which was four more than last year. This represents substantial growth over recent years, considering that five years ago there were only 12. This was achieved even though we launched a new judging category this year, which may have pulled some entries away from JCNA. The Regularly Driven (previously Daily Driver) category shrank in numbers as many moved up to the JCNA level.

We strengthened our OJOA claim about hosting an international Concours with five American participants......four entrants plus Mike Meyer, our JCNA regional rep. Pat Geary from Erie, PA ventured north five years ago, and we are slowly building on that. The OJOA used to attract competitors from our southern neighbours in the '80's, but even then, there may not have been as many as this year's four.

Here is another piece of trivia that I've gleaned from our archives. John and Joyce Ogden now have the distinction of entering the most consecutive Concours of any currently active participant. Congratulations for that persistence.



And a database is not needed to realize that our show had more "Wow" cars to get our attention, as compared to last year. A 1947 Jaguar Saloon, an XK120, two Mark II's, a 1972 XJ6 (very appropriate given that this year is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the XJ6), a 3.8S Saloon, and a 2016 F-Type Project 7 are all rare by today's standard, and none were present at our 2017 Concours. Sam and Ross Quigley's Project 7 was accompanied by their 1975 V12 Jaguar engined Panther. The word "rare" does not adequately describe that model. As proof of our show's diversity, we had at least one Jaguar entry in 18 separate JCNA classes, a detail that I know to be an all-time record.

A "prowl" (group of jaguars) is seldom seen due to their solitary nature, but E-Type Jaguars must be a social species. We had a prowl of nine. Actually, it would not be fake news for me to say that we reached double digit E-Types on the property on August 12<sup>th</sup>, given the reclusive Series III hiding in the garage.

This year's Concours edition will also be remembered for the roll out of a new judging category called "Senior Division". Steve Sherriff invested hours working on the logistics of his brainchild and the results were worthy of the effort. This is meant to attract the best of the best as well as distinguished Jaguars. We had four entries that did justice to that definition......Tony's Mark II, D'Arcy Black's 2017 Best in Show XK8, and Brad Marsland's two E-Types. (Brad's '64 has competed at Cobble Beach and Concours d'Elegance of America.) Mike Meyer, myself, and Steve judged this category, and the results were close, as expected.

The people part of the show (as opposed to the Jaguars) was organized much the same as what proved successful last year. We brought back the noon catered meal, the silent auction, gift bags, door prizes, and the noon time live band. Our Bernese Mountain Dog was also talked into contributing once again, as he was harnessed up to a cart and led in the parade of judges. The ladies hat contest though, was retired, and replaced by a cookie decorating contest, using Jaguar shaped cookies.

The Concours host hotel idea that was an experiment two years ago, has now almost become an event by itself. There was strong growth this year with 22 rooms reserved and 45 people in attendance at the Saturday evening meet and greet meal. This year we are delighted to report that there were no flat tires in the parking lot......right Pete? Paragraph after paragraph in this article has been dedicated to answering the question..."Was there anything that made this year's Concours stand out?" And while all of the above were valid answers, from my perspective, this Concours stood out for the volume of support that I received from volunteers. In the past two years, my post Concours summary singled out the individuals who helped with the show. This year I'm proud to say that the list is too long for the space that I'm allotted. I sincerely appreciate the unprecedented level of support for every task that needed to be done, from judging to parking to site set-up, and much more. I will mention two names as examples of this.....D'Arcy Black and Roy Stevenson. They spent many hours at my place working hard at yard preparation and clean up. A specific thank you is in order for all of the silent auction donors. The club raised \$685 through the auction and we still have many items available for a future auction! \

Our small but mighty Concours committee, composed of Tracy Kailan, Steve Sherriff, John Myers, and myself, can now consider ourselves professionals, and are available for hire!

Steve was in charge of judging, and as such, hosted an excellent judging school. We now have a strong pool of judges with several apprentice judges ready to step in. (An interesting side benefit from one of our sponsors was the addition of Haggerty representative Cory Finkelstein to both our judging roster, as well as to our club membership.) Steve's position as head judge may have been the most stressful on Concours day. He managed to hide that fact well! Leading up to, and on Concours day itself, Tracy was in charge of registration, the silent auction, the door prize giveaway, the meal tickets, the cookie competition, and keeping Chris focused on cleaning their entered Jags. If Tracy ever goes on strike, the Concours organization and operation will face serious difficulty. Given that unfortunate circumstance, I suggest that her pay should be doubled to immediately settle the dispute.







John provided the oversight that kept us all on the straight and narrow. He hosted the meet and greet in his professional and humorous manner, judged at the JCNA level, and provided much assistance on both set-up day and Concours day. I can't begin to list all the ways that my wife Carol contributed. If there was some colour in our yard, if you appreciated the band, if you received a gift bag, if you enjoyed some breakfast refreshments, if you enjoyed the set-up day food, if the awards were labelled correctly, if...., if...., if...., then Carol deserves credit.

The combined total of Jaguars parked at our Concours day site over the past three years was 147 and that compares with a combined total of 97 over the previous 2013 to 2015 three year period. This represents a growth of 50% during a period of Concours decline at most JCNA clubs.

As Concours site hosts, Carol and I knew, when the offer was made to the club, that our property would be less than ideal for that purpose. We appreciate three years of almost no complaints, and the very few that surfaced had more to do with the Concours structure rather than the site itself. Certainly three straight years of great Concours day weather was a bonus. Thank you to everyone who participated in one way or another. Factor in the BBQ picnic that we hosted four years ago, and it's safe to say that many GPS systems now have "Wellesley" deeply stored in their memories.

The OJOA now moves the Concours site to the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum, so let's not lose any momentum. This is a phenomenal location and the date of Sunday August 11, 2019 should be highlighted on every member's calendar. An enthusiastic Mike Parry will be the Concours chairperson, and the host hotel is already holding a block of rooms for us. In the North Central JCNA region, only the Jaguar Club of Ohio has a larger Concours attendance, and this year that lead was less than a dozen cars. 2019 represents the 60th anniversary of the OJOA club, so let's use that number as a Concours target to surpass!

#### Kim Morgan – World War Two British Army Staff Car Driver ... by David Bousfield

In my various travels through the week, I meet with some interesting people. And I have occasion to visit with two very elderly ladies who have come to be residents of the Veterans Wing of Sunnybrook Hospital on Bayview Avenue north of Eglinton.

Kathleen (Kitty) Hawker is almost ninety-eight, and she served with the Royal Canadian Air Force during World War II. She served at the Cape Spear Radar Station, the scanner making its sweeps out into the ocean in search of enemy ships or aircraft that might be moving about off that easternmost tip of Newfoundland.

Kim Morgan recently turned ninety-nine. During World War II, she served in the British Army as a staff car driver. Kim took part in the Normandy Landing, not on D-Day itself, but shortly thereafter when the Mulberry Harbour had been put in place at Arromanches. And Kim wrote about driving a Humber Super Snipe staff car off a cargo ship and onto the floating bridge, and onto the shore, in a chapter which was given over to her in a book,

The Memory of All That:

Canadian Women Remember World War II, the twenty-five stories put together by Ruth Latta, General Store Publishing House, Burnstown, 1992. Should you ever find opportunity to read this book, I most heartily commend it to you. It is a fine read concerning what was going on during those wartime years, and given from many different perspectives. Kim Morgan wrote this in the chapter given to her:

A wind has sprung up and in spite of mock-up training on the landing stage 'Mulberry,' disembarking is a rather more perilous experience on a swinging, seemingly fragile bridge. However, all goes well, and we follow the convoy leading us to Bayeux – our temporary home in dug-outs and under canvas for the next month. On landing, the first thing we notice apart from driving on the 'wrong' side of the road are the well-organized military signs, directions and white-taped verges denoting unexploded mines. We are directed to our quarters in a field outside the town, where we park and service our Humbers and unpack our kit and bedding in our coconut-matting lined trench-huts. Very cosy.

Even though the fighting is audible less than five kilometres away, we feel considerably safer than sitting, impotent, in a London shelter.

**Humber Super Snipe British Army Staff Car** 



How did it come about that Kim became a driver of British Army staff cars? Here are her words:

My parents, meanwhile, had closed our house in London and were living in Edinburgh where my father was serving as a staff officer at Scottish Command. I joined them there and volunteered my services as a driver/mechanic with the F.A.N.Y. staff car and ambulance unit attached to Scottish Command headquarters. The First Aid Nursing Yeomanry (sometimes irreverently referred to by the troops as "Fannys"), I knew to be a military women's corps with a distinguished history. Originating at the time of the Boer War in the late 19th century, and attached to the cavalry, nursing personnel rode horseback onto the battlefields, attending the sick and wounded.



By the First World War, the corps had become a mechanized unit driving ambulances and staff cars in the field. As well, in World War II, a division of the F.A.N.Y.s served as intelligence officers parachuting into France to assist the Resistance. It was the transport division in which for the next four years I would be privileged to serve.

As was to be expected, there were some moments when things became more than a little tense. Here is what took place during one of those moments which was certainly longer than a brief moment.

An assignment to drive a Brigadier
to a point north of Caen meant
driving back alone after dark in the black-out.
Caen had been bulldozed flat
after very heavy fighting and,
through the rubble, I managed
to miss military signs and lose my way.
No one was about, and the rank,
sickening smell of death filled the night air.
A true moment of fear: but eventually
I pulled hold of myself, spied a Jeep
and followed its dim tail-lights back to Bayeux.



While chatting with Kim Morgan, I asked if she had ever been called upon to drive military vehicles other than the Humber staff car. She replied that the F.A.N.Y. drivers had to be able to drive just about any kind of vehicle. Kim always wanted to drive a Sherman tank, but those in charge would not let her do so . . . perhaps they felt that she could do quite enough damage with her Humber staff car.

Production of civilian vehicles had come to a halt in Britain when war broke out in September 1939. Humber had introduced its six-cylinder Super Snipe the year previously, and the British military found that it would make a fine staff car for its officers: the Super Snipe was large and very comfortable. To me, the Humber Super Snipe really has the look of an American car, giving the impression of being a curious mix of Packard, Buick, Chrysler, Hudson, with a touch of Ford thrown in for good measure.



In my rummaging through the internet, I found some material on 'Monty's Humber'. And I felt that you would find this material to be interesting. However, as this article is about Kim Morgan, I would like to include more of her words, which begin to sound like they were taken from a movie. I advise you to have some tissues close at hand.

It is during this time, on my first assignment to Paris shortly after its liberation that I meet a young senior officer who perhaps would change my life. Back in Brussels we continue to date and, though neither of us is "free", fall very much in love. Our next trip to Paris is one of those high points in my life. Paris is still without heat but flowing with champagne: we wrap ourselves in blankets in our best hotel rooms, dance on rose-tinted glass floors in the clubs to the strains of "Amour, Amour" and other sentimental wartime songs, enjoy the Folies Bergere and Lido shows, and take fiacre drives after dark through the Champs Elysee and the Bois de Boulogne. All very seductive in any young person's life!



In Germany we are comfortably quartered in a previously occupied Luftwaffe compound in Hereford, a small town west of Hanover and south of Hamburg. Our driving duties take us through shattered towns, and through some of the most beautiful countryside of Germany on our way to Berlin and Belsen (which I prefer not to remember).



It is a land of contrasts. Off duty, we are permitted to visit (with armed escorts) nearby farms bartering cakes of soap for a few fresh eggs. Occasionally in the woods we run into dishevelled bands of German soldiers (deserters?) but we remain calm and exchange affable "Guten Tags", and no incidents occur. Hitler commits suicide on the 30th of April and Montgomery accepts the surrender of all German forces in northwest Germany, Holland, and Denmark. Remaining German forces surrender to American headquarters in Rheims three days later. On May 8th, in London, as Big Ben strikes 3 p.m., Winston Churchill broadcasts to the world that a German unconditional surrender has been signed.

A few years ago, the family of Kim Morgan heard that the Government of France was giving awards to those who had aided France during the war years. They contacted the French authorities who then searched out the records of Kim Morgan. In 2016, Kim was awarded the French Legion of Honour.


