The OJOA 52nd Concours d' Elegance event was shared on Facebook. A few people, not associated with OJOA, found out about and through Facebook attended our very successful event.



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OJOA's 52nd· Concours Scores A Three Point Landing At The

Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum

On August 11th, 2019, the Ontario Jaguar Owners' Association hosted the largest field of entries for competition and display in the last quarter century of OJOA Concours d'Elegance with 65 Jaguars registered, 45 for competition and 20 for display. This ties a record that was set in the early 1990's. Sadly the record was not broken as, for a variety of reasons, 5 registered Jaguars, which would have brought the total up to 70 were unable to join us at the last minute.

No doubt the 70 entrants were lured by the fact that their cars, judged by JCNA/OJOA rules, were going to be parked indoors in the CWHM hanger alongside notable historic aircraft like the Avro Lancaster, the C-47 Dakota and the B-25 Mitchell to name a few of the aircraft from Canada's rich wartime history.

And come they did! Even though the vast majority of Jaguar registrations came from Ontario, we had a record six Jaguars from the states of Michigan (JCNA Judge Chuck & Louise Diamond), New Mexico (Jchn& Kimberly Dias), New York (Bruce Diane Boncke), Ohio (JCNA's Vice-President Mike Meyer), Pennsylvania (JCNA Judge Pat Geary) and Virginia (Steve Quilty). One member from the JCNA Club of South Florida, Victor Hernandez Sr. and his son, Victor Jr. detoured from touring various New York State campuses to join us at our 52nd Concours thereby showing the importance of a well balanced education!

This year's 52nd Concours had Jaguars representing eight decades of our favourite Marque from Doug Black's 1947 Jaguar Saloon to OJOA President John Myers' 2019 I-Pace with many notable cars in between those 72 years.

In our OJOA Senior Division, with five cars in this elite competition, we had such Jaguar treats as Tony Burgess' rare 1997 XJ220S, Julien Brosseau's 1950 Mark V DHC, Brian jamieson's 1973 E-Type OTS, Brad Marsland's 1963 E-Type FHC and Sam Quigley's 2016 Project 7 F-Type. It is also interesting to note our Tony Burgess probably set a record for most number of entries registered in a Canadian based Concours d'Elegance with four entries though Brad Marsland and Sam Quigley were certain contenders with each having two cars entered. One has to guess that the key to having multiple entries is not just having the Jaguars but having the drivers to deliver them to the venue!

An interesting point gleaned from our 52nd Concours registrations is that the most prolific Jaguar in attendance was the E-Type AND the XJS with 8 entries apiece. Nowifonly Chief Judge Steve Sherriff and OJOA Co-Editor Chris Kailan had their XJS's in attendance, we would have seen a seismic shift in the Force and the XJS Galaxy! Next year!

Meanwhile, back on Earth, we had, as our host hotel, the Best Western Brantford Hotel & Conference Centre with some 20 rooms booked and 35 JCNA/OJOA members enjoying a roast beef dinner and Jaguar fellowship Saturday night. It is rumoured that the party continued after dinner but your correspondent could have no part in that as he had to be at the CWHM site at 7:00am to set up and help the other volunteers prepare for the day's events.

Such an event as a well established Concours at a new location and with a new chairman can bring its challenges but we were fortunate that the day went without a hitch owing to the fantastic support of seasoned and rookie OJOA Concours volunteers, as well as Cathy Dowd and her staff at the CWHM. The "Can Do" spirit of all involved from the OJOA Board and Concours Committee was infectious to say the least. There are several people that must be publicly thanked for their contribution before and during this 52nd Concours. First of all, one must recognize the efforts of our own Queen of the Spreadsheet, Tracy Kailan who owing to her mastery in Excel was able to keep the Concours Committee focused and informed of our registrations as they came in. Roberta Allen helped the very day of the Concours manning the outdoor registration desk with her usual grace and pace.

Steve Sherriff, our resident Chief Judge with his team of seventeen judges including JCNA Judges, Pat Geary, Mike Meyer & Chuck Diamond managed to master the ever increasing number of entrants down to the wire and they all delivered what was expected of them. Jenny Baker made sure that those judging tallies were documented and completed in a very timely and professional manner. Mark Smith, our Marshall of Jaguar Parking and Placement ably assisted by James Parry and Julian Walkowiak made sure that all judged cars were afforded a parking berth within the CWHM hanger and in the shadow of several examples of Canada's rich aviation history. New OJOA Board Member Josephine O'Brien, our Maven of Mass Media, showed us the potential of Facebook which culminated in the arrival of one Facebook follower's PINK Jaguar, a first no doubt at any Concours d'Elegance in North America!

Remember it was a Mary Kay Pink Jaguar and in no way should be confused with the Pink Panther.







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"A Celebration Evening Appropriate of a Diamond Anniversary"

Were you present at the OJOA's 60th Anniversary Gala at the Old Mill? I hope so, because as far as anniversary celebrations go, it may be another 10 or 15 years before we catch up to another calendar milestone like that. However, the same was probably said a month after the 50th gala in 2009, and as a club we not only survived but flourished over that 10 year interval, so onward we optimistically go from here!

My purpose is not to prognosticate the future though, but rather to offer a summary of what is now in our rear-view mirror.....our Friday the 13th event. It may be assumed that the seeds for a 60th anniversary celebration event sprouted with the formation last year of our committee composed of Tracy Kailan, Pete Moffett, John Myers, and myself. And yet the inspiration for this challenge preceded that by 9 years, with the extremely successful 50th extravaganza orchestrated by Steve Sherriff. That show was so well done that we borrowed heavily on many of the ideas.

Pete Moffett started the ball rolling with his search for a suitable venue for our guests, and the Old Mill Toronto facility rose to the top. The Old Mill, the OJOA monthly meeting home for many years during our earliest club era, has turned out to be absolutely fantastic to work with. No doubt other groups feel the same way, and that demand narrowed our selection to our Friday the 13th reservation. Even a full nine months in advance, the September dates available left us with few options. Besides, it's a well-known fact that driving a vintage Jaguar can periodically invoke some bad luck on any day of the month so, as members of a Jaguar club, we are now numb to the bad luck legend of Friday the 13th.....even if the risk was amplified by a full moon as well!

One of the advantages of the Old Mill venue is the ability to bring automobiles into the dining hall itself. We took advantage of that option with a pair of Jaguars from our club's incorporation era, as well as a third brand new Jag, representing the 60 year span.

Early on in the planning, our committee, with support from the OJOA board, sought to partially subsidize the gala with assistance from sponsors and club funds. This would serve to keep the cost to the guests at a reasonable level, and stimulate attendance. This seemed to have the desired effect as exactly 100 guests attended the event, which according to my memory, made our celebration party the best attended OJOA dining function since the 50th a decade ago.

As with any sizable event, there always are challenges that need to be dealt with. Any keen-eyed reader of the evening program, at each place setting, would have noticed a description of a Jaguar, as well as a keynote speaker, conspicuously absent from the hall. The weather forecast for that evening was rather ominous, and that caused the withdrawal of the Mark IX. This disappointment was amplified by the cancellation of the speaking engagement by the Jaguar Land Rover President only the day before our gala. The reason was very understandable, but in both instances, the alterations required came after the program was printed.

Tony Burgess came to the rescue to fill the last-moment car vacancy with his 1961 Mark II. His gem was accompanied by Gordon and Gina Gadsby's 1959 Mark 1, and John Myers' 2019 I-Pace. The effort required to move these vehicles in and out of the hall was time consuming and not exactly insignificant. Many, many thanks are owed to these owners for their contributions to our evening.

Across the hall from our three autos stood the podium at which three guest speakers took their turns during the gala. Mike Meyer, the JCNA VP and our Regional Representative, made the trek from Ohio to address our guests on behalf of JCNA. For those who know Mike and his many appearances at our Concours, we should not be surprised at his willingness to attend, but that in no way diminishes our appreciation of his participation.

Steve Sherriff, our resident club historian, delivered a stirring history lesson in his typical entertaining manner that few others can emulate. Steve also used his opportunity to introduce the OJOA's founding member number 19, Grant Head, and his wife Brenda. Until Grant requested tickets to our celebration, we had no idea about him, or his connection to the club back in its very earliest times. The "discovery" of Mr. Head had to be the most shocking development during our 60th anniversary year, and the Board has unanimously granted Grant an honorary membership. This was presented to him by our membership directory Mike Parry during our gala dinner, followed by a few words from Grant himself.

Our keynote speaker was John Lindo, the Marketing and Public Relations Director for Jaguar Land Rover Canada. We certainly appreciate that John stepped in on short notice when it became apparent that the President would be unable to attend. As would be expected from a Director of Marketing, John delivered an excellent speech and video presentation of the current and future product offerings of Jaguar Land Rover.

Therefore, by the close of the evening performance, the guests had been led through 60 years of club existence.....from a founding father in 1959, through anecdotes about our history over the years, to the connections with our affiliate host JCNA, and on to the present and future automobiles which define our club.



Guests then departed with more than just memories at the end of the evening. Special 60th anniversary OJOA labelled wine accompanied by a pair of club logo etched wine glasses were passed out to each couple.

I would be amiss if I didn't single out our committee members for special recognition for the considerable effort invested in this event. Tracy Kailan, the spreadsheet queen of our concours, displayed that talent once again during the 60th anniversary gala production. 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
